- 1. Reducing new HIV infections
- 2. Increasing access to care and improving health outcomes for people living with HIV
- 3. Reducing HIV-related health disparities



Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program

- Serves more than half a million people each year
- Ryan White-funded programs are located in each State and in many cities around the country
- Critical to the success of the National HIV/AIDS Strategy








CDC's mission is to collaborate to create the expertise, information, and tools that people and communities need to protect their health – through health promotion, prevention of disease, injury, and disability, and preparedness for new health threats.





- 1.2 million people are living with HIV in the U.S.
- Number of people living with HIV has risen every year because incidence is relatively stable and survival has increased







Health Disparities

- Men who have sex with men (MSM) are >40 times more likely to have HIV than other men and women
- African Americans are 8 times more likely, and Latinos 3 times more likely, to have HIV than whites
- 54% of people with AIDS are living in 5 states; 90% in 23 states
- HIV prevalence related to socioeconomic status
 - Lower household income and education, lack of employment, and homelessness associated with higher HIV prevalence





What can we do for HIV prevention?

- National HIV/AIDS Strategy
- Increase awareness, reduce complacency, and encourage action
- Use epidemiology, science, and socioeconomic data to target resources and choose interventions
- Expand HIV testing
- Ensure linkage to, and retention in, treatment and prevention services
- National HIV Testing Day is June 27, 2011


